



2nd Annual International HIV/AIDS Research Day

Call for abstracts

Due Date: Monday, August 11, 2008

Required components: Abstracts should contain the following four components, with an emphasis on international research related to HIV or associated infections/diseases. Please bold the four section headings within the text of your abstract submission.

- **Background:** a concise statement of the issue under investigation or a hypothesis;
- **Methods:** the experimental methods used (including the statistical analyses employed);
- **Results:** specific findings (promises such as “to be completed” or “to be presented” are not acceptable); and
- **Conclusions:** a summary of findings that are supported by your results. (Statistical analyses used to support the conclusions, where appropriate, should be included; concluding statements such as “the results will be discussed” are not acceptable.)

Please do not include grant acknowledgements, literature references, or copyright or trademark symbols.

Formatting

- **Title:** Use a concise title that indicates the content of the abstract. Italicize specific names of microorganisms.
- **Authors:** Authors' names should be typed in upper- and lowercase letters (please do not use all capital letters). Use first name and last name. Indicate the presenting author and include his or her e-mail address and business phone. There is a limit of 10 authors per abstract.
- **Affiliations:** If domestic, each author should be listed by institution, city, state, and country. If international, each author should be listed by institution, city, and country. Do not include department, division, laboratory, or acknowledgements.
- **Abstract Body:** Abstracts are limited to 2,500 characters, including spaces.
