

DOUGLAS RICHMAN, MD

Dr. Doug Richman is the founding director at the Center for AIDS Research at UCSD. He is a Distinguished Professor of Pathology and Medicine (Active Emeritus) and held the Florence Seeley Riford Chair in AIDS Research until going Active Emeritus in 2019. He played a key role in developing the first antiretroviral drugs and designing early clinical trials for HIV treatment. His current research centers on the latent HIV reservoir and efforts to eradicate it. Dr. Richman is a Fellow of several prestigious scientific societies and has made significant contributions understanding HIV to pathogenesis, treatment, and drug resistance.

In his free time, Dr. Richman enjoys food and wine, reading books, and exercise including jogging, tennis, swimming, and skiing. He lives with his wife of 58 years and his son, daughter, and granddaughter are close by in San Diego.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHT

DNA methylation, an epigenetic mechanism that usually turns off gene expression, can also silence HIV in lab models. However, its role in HIV persistence in people on ART is unclear. Differences in where the virus integrates into the genome, how many functional copies are present, biased sampling, and PCR amplification can all affect results. New research on DNA methylation in genes gives us important clues about how it might work in HIV.
