ALEKSANDER (ALEKS) GEORGIAN

Aleks is an undergraduate volunteer majoring in Biochemistry who has been a part of our lab for the past year and a half. Driven by a profound commitment to HIV/AIDS research, he joined team to contribute our meaningfully to this field. Aleks has been collaborating with Dr. Elizabeth Hastie on the titled "Viral and Microbial project Environment in the Male Genital Tract of People Living with HIV," which was recently submitted to the Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections (CROI).

Beyond his work in the lab, Aleksander is on the board of the Global Medical Brigades chapter at UCSD, where he helps organize annual trips to underserved communities to provide essential medical and dental care to thousands of residents. Last year, he participated in a trip to Belize (pictured above), and he will lead the upcoming mission to Guatemala. In addition to these commitments, Aleksander serves as an EMT, practices archery, listens to music, and studies art. With aspirations to pursue a career in medicine, he aims to continue advocating for and aiding those in need.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHT

The study "Quality of Life in People with HIV at the End of Life: Preliminary Results from the Last Gift Observational Cohort Study" investigates quality of life (QOL) and mental health in people with HIV (PWH) nearing the end of life (EOL). Conducted in Southern California from 2017 to 2023, the study enrolled 35 PWH with a prognosis of six months or less, all actively engaged in HIV cure-related research. The participants, primarily older (median age 62.7), White, and male, underwent structured assessments focusing on QOL and mental health. specifically neurologic and psychiatric conditions like depression and anxiety.

The findings reveal stable QOL scores among participants, with an inverse relationship observed between QOL and depressive symptoms (measured by the Beck Depression Inventory, or BDI). Higher QOL scores were linked with lower depressive symptoms (p < 0.001), suggesting that research participation may positively impact mental health or QOL in PWH at EOL. The study recommends future interventions to enhance the well-being of PWH in EOL settings through tailored research and mental health support.
